Declaration of Minor: Data Analytics

The Data Analytics Minor brings together perspectives from information technology, quantitative math and information management to solve data intensive problems in a number of varying fields, including: finance, retail, health, non-profits and government. Students who pursue the minor will be well prepared for numerous high-demand and rewarding internships and careers.

It is available to matriculated undergraduate students from all Syracuse University schools and colleges other than the iSchool, provided that they have the permission of their home school or college, a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of at least 3.4 at the end of the semester of application, and a minimum of four semesters to complete the requirements.

Decisions on acceptance to this minor are made on a space available basis. There are two deadlines for submitting applications: 5:00 p.m. on December 7, 2018 and 5:00 p.m. April 30, 2019.

To Declare a Minor in Data Analytics

- 1. Check with your home school or college advising office to make sure you have room in your program for the required courses. Also check to confirm that your GPA is 3.4+.
- 2. Obtain a minor application form in Hinds 114 (keeping in mind the deadlines).
- 3. Bring the completed minor declaration form to Hinds 114 before the deadline. If you are approved, you will be notified via email at the end of the semester and asked to pick up the form.
- 4. Take the signed form to your home school or college office. They will approve the declaration and give you instructions about how to get the minor officially posted to your SU transcript.

Transferring Courses into Minors in the iSchool

All 18 credits must be taken through Syracuse University for a letter grade. No transfer credit will be considered for the Data Analytics Minor.
